PROGRAM RECAP

**14** girls successfully **completed** 1 year in the CORRAL program



**60** girls will enroll in a CORRAL program in 2014/2015

## 100% of our girls

- Saw a significant reduction in disruptive behavior for which they were referred.
- Showed improvement in positive replacement behavior.
- Had no new court complaints or adjudications.



Average attendance in school: **98.5%**

**92%** of Riding Academy participants has C's or better and the average GPA of a CORRAL girl is a 3.0

**92%**

of girls suffer from depression or suicidal thoughts or actions

**85%**

of girls have experienced trauma or neglect

**79%**

have failed a course in school

**56%**

are being raised in single parent homes

**18%**

of our girls are gang involved

**51%**

have behavior problems in school

**23%**

are court-involved

**41%**

do not live with either biological parent

**26%**

have struggled with prior substance abuse

**59%**

of our girls have been victims of abuse or trafficking
