## PROGRAM RECAP

B- is the average final grade in school, when **82%** were previously failing classes before CORRAL



While all of the Riding Academy girls demonstrate at least one major risk factor (*abuse, neglect, trauma, substance abuse, promiscuous behaviors, self-harm*), **NONE** of the Riding Academy participants were involved in **risky behaviors** by the end of the school year

80% of girls have experienced neglect, abuse and trauma, yet **100% of girls are rising above it by growing in social and emotional skills\***

*\*this is measured by a 360 evaluation tool for emotional intelligence*



**100%** of our high-school seniors have matriculated into college



## OUR STAFF & CHAMPIONS



CORRAL staff and volunteers provided **9500 hours of service** this year with each Riding Academy girl receiving over **600 hours of direct service** (including tutoring, therapy or vocational training)



CORRAL engaged **355 new volunteers this year** who offered an estimated **8000 hours of service**

**69% of our champions** (volunteers and donors) returned to serve again in FY 14-15
