83% of girls improved their GPA



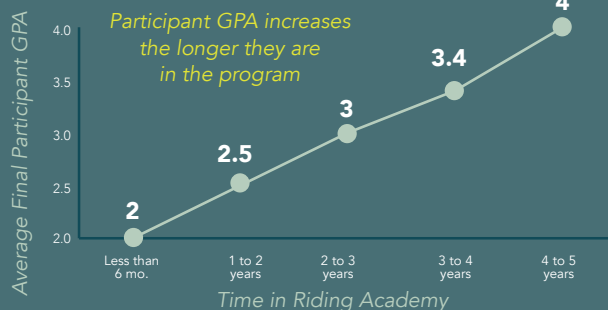
Emotional Intelligence Quotient* improved **82%**
