NONE of the Riding Academy participants were involved in risky

behaviors by the end of the school year

80% of girls have experienced neglect, abuse and trauma, yet 100% of girls are rising above it by growing in social and emotional skills*

*this is measured by a 360 evaluation tool for emotional intelligence



100% of our high-school seniors have matriculated into college



OUR STAFF & CHAMPIONS

CORRAL staff and volunteers provided **9500 hours of service** this year with each Riding Academy girl receiving over **600 hours of direct service** (including tutoring, therapy or vocational training)



corract engaged 355 new volunteers this year who offered an estimated 8000 hours of service

69% of our champions (volunteers and donors) returned to serve again in FY 14-15
